Eligibility is restricted to men in Southern Tasmania who have been assessed as being at a medium to high risk of re-offending post release.

The program is also suitable for men who have completed a long sentence.

Returning to the community can be a difficult transition for many men leaving the prison system. The challenges they face can be overwhelming and complex.

PROP is a transitional program providing sustainable and on-going support to men pre and post release, to increase the likelihood that they will successfully rejoining the community without re-offending.

Program participation will commence up to 3 months prior to release and continue for up to 12 months following release.

PROP will suit individuals who are willing to challenge the behaviours that have supported their previous offending behaviour. Participation is essential during this process and throughout the program.

Eligible clients are those due for release, who have a high risk of re-offending or a significant likelihood that they may return to prison. Referral is through the Tasmanian Prison Service.

Participation is voluntary and must accompany evidence of motivation or willingness to embrace change.

Clients may have previously been unable to break through the barriers to reintegration

PROP supports the development of through-care within the Tasmanian Justice System.

PROP aims to coordinate and facilitate seamless access to government and non-government service providers for clients.
